### 2024 Enrolments:

- OWNA Enrolments for 2024 have opened this month. Started with Prep and Siblings of preps only and then the following week opened to everyone.
- Due to bookings rolling over the influx of enrolments have been steadier. Easier to manage than 2023 enrolment period.
- OWNA still have some migrating issues with enrolments, we are working with them to sort this out.

- So far service looking to go to approximately 340 for beginning of first term with a gradual increase to 400.
- All families receiving their current bookings for 2024 any additions are being dealt with as they come in.

### Staffing:

- We will lose over 12 staff during the upcoming December/January vacation care due to personal holidays. This will mean that our positions for students will decrease.
- Coordinators are working alongside the Business manager to discuss the structure of staff for 2024.
- Kat (Coordinator) will be on Maternity Leave from January 2024.
- Gillian (Coordinator) will be on Maternity Leave (resigned) from March 2024.
- Currently working with BSHS, Tafe QLD and Universities around Brisbane for casual educators, with ads out on social media also.
- Hired approximately 7 new casual educators for the build up of children in 2024 and for Vacation Care.
- Ad's to go out for AC & Coordinator role for 2024.


Generous contributions from the community came to over \$1700 for the night. Overall profit still being determined.

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# Grants

### Grants Liaison Officers – Phuong Trinh & Li-Ann Leon

Met with Tony (Principal) in regards to the future needs of the school. Shade is a priority. Investigations will continue to target grants that allow for fixed shade structures around the school to complement any P&C funds that are contributed.

Unable to apply for Community Road Safety Grant contact with the Road Safety Advisor was not possible. It was a prerequisite to be eligible to discuss and have approved by a Road Safety Advisor for SE QLD

Application will be attempted for the next round.

In addition to bike education, figuring a plan to implement a bike bus (with rotating families leading) would actually be important to have reduce drop-off congestion.

Unfortunately, we were unsuccessful in our application for Queensland Cancer Council portable shade project.

Plans to apply for the <u>Community Gambling Benefit fund</u> (super round, \$100k, Q1 2024) remain in place.
